4. How values are part of our school life

Our values are central to life at our school. The paired values complement one another and give opportunity to deepen our understanding of each. By focusing on them for a half term we are able to explore the values fully. These are some of the ways in which they guide our school life:

Collective worship – the values are integral to our daily collective worship. They are a focal point and connections are made to them in many ways including the stories that are chosen, the hymns that are sung, in the opportunities to reflect as well as in the prayers.

Prayers - each half term the children write prayers that focus on the values, these prayers are written after the first Collective Worship which introduces the values and are then shared in subsequent Collective Worship including in church.

Teaching and learning – throughout the school day children are reminded about the values and time is given to reflect on them and to make links with their learning.

The values are also part of our weekly newsletters and are displayed around school.

Policies – our policies reflect our values and form the foundations on which the policies are written and revised.

School Improvement Plan – the strands of development in our annual school improvement plan are founded on our school Vision and Values.

5. Living a full life

We also strive to support our children in leading a full life. We do this in a wide range of ways including supporting their personal development, through our nurture and care of the children, the provision of a wealth of opportunity in their school life and through an aspirational curriculum and through our inclusive provision.
