Current Challenges:

- County SEND Team issues: poor communication, long delays in paperwork/ funding being agreed causes problems with staffing and support

-County SEND are working on improvements but there is not much change evident at schoollevel yet.

Staff training and skills – providing high levels of support in-house


Do you feel listened to by the school? 100%: Yes
